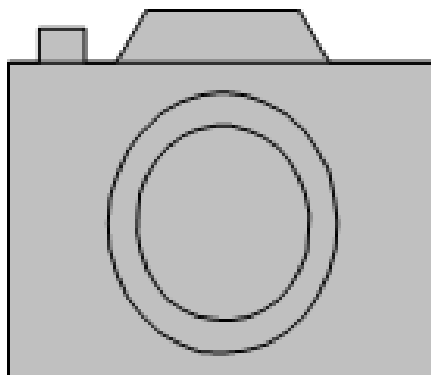
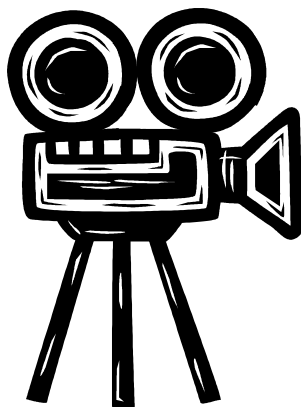

# PHOTOGRAPHY AND VIDEO RIGHTS

The Organisers would like to bring the regulation on photography and filming to the attention of exhibitors, trade stands, press and visitors. It is a condition of all those attending the event that no filming or other form of recording may be taken or made at the venue without the express written permission of the Organisers. The taking of photographs in the show venue for sale or reward is strictly prohibited except with the written permission of the Organisers. Press accredited photographers are provided with permission to take photographs **ONLY** for the use in newspapers, magazines and internet sites – this is for news purposes only. There is no objection to the general public taking photographs of general views of the Show, provided that these are for private use. Specific dogs may be photographed only with the approval of the exhibitor. No photographs or filming is permitted in breed judging rings whilst judging is actually taking place. However, judges may allow it to happen at the end of classes or after the Challenge Certificate is awarded. Filming and flash photography is allowed from outside the rings at all times unless the operation of the camera is actually affecting exhibits. However, if a powerful flash unit is used or it is clear that exhibits are being affected, a ring steward or the judge is empowered to stop the person concerned.

## RULES & REGULATIONS

1. The Show will open at 07.30 am.
2. Dogs will be received at any time but it is the responsibility of the exhibitor to have exhibits available when required.
3. Judging will not commence not before 09.00 am
4. Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. The Show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed.
5. The use of cooking stoves in the proximity of the tenting & benching areas is forbidden except as authorised by the Show Management.
6. **ENTRY FEES.** £5.00 first entry for each dog & £2.00 for subsequent with same dog. Pre-paid catalogues £2.00, £2.50 on the day. Car Park passes will not be sent out; pay-on-the-day must be displayed.
7. Prize Money will NOT be paid at this show.
8. **REFUSAL OF ENTRIES:** The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries or advertisements.

9. **PUPPIES:** Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition. Puppies aged 4 months and over can be entered **NOT FOR COMPETITION**.
10. **MATING OF BITCHES:** The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
11. **BEST PUPPY IN SHOW:** Where a Best Puppy in Show is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed & is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same Show. A puppy is a dog of six & not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best of Breed or Best in Show is a puppy it will automatically be Best Puppy in Breed & Best Puppy in Show respectively. Consequently selection of Best Puppy in Breed & Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best of Breed & Best in Show respectively.
12. **BEST IN SHOW:** The dog declared Best in Show is a dog which has competed & Unbeaten by any other dog exhibited at the same Show. Best in Show must be selected from the exhibits declared Best of Sex providing they are unbeaten winning dogs. Reserve Best in Show must be selected from the Best Opposite Sex and the Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best in Show.

**WITHDRAWAL FROM COMPETITION:** Dogs which become eligible for Best in Show may be withdrawn from all other competition other than Breed classes and Best of Breed prior to the competition for Best in Show as appropriate in order to remain unbeaten. A dog beaten in competition for Best in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dogs declared Best in Show & Reserve Best in Show, however, must not compete in any subsequent competition.

**PROVISO:** For the purpose of this Regulation, dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dogs, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace & Team or a Special Award confirmed to one breed will not be considered to be a beaten dog.

13. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of 10 minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.
14. **REGULATIONS:** No modification will be made to this schedule except by permission of the General Committee of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the canine press wherever possible.
15. **PREPARATION FOR EXHIBITION:** All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F Annex B – Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
16. **OVERSEAS EXHIBITS:** All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.

17. Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts traveling to and whilst at KC licensed events.
- a. When traveling to a Show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
  - b. If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether traveling to the show is a good idea at all.
  - c. The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
  - d. Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
  - e. When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
  - f. Keep the dog in the shade – take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
  - g. Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time. Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.

**WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.**

Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules & Regulations.

18. **NOT FOR COMPETITION:** Not for Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered.
19. **SECTION F11. EXHIBITION OF DOGS:**
- a) No person shall carry out punitive correction or harsh handling of a dog at any time whilst at the licensed venue, including its environs, car parks and approaches.
  - b) The owner, exhibitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog at a Kennel Club licensed event must at all times ensure that the dog is kept under proper control whilst at the licensed venue, including its environs, car park and approaches. This regulation applies before (at any time during the set up period at the venue), during the event and afterwards (at any time during the breakdown of the event).

## DEFINITION OF CLASSES

1. In the following definitions a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club.
2. Wins at Championship Shows in Breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows.
3. In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the Society.
4. In estimating the number of award won all wins up to & including the seventh day before the date of closing of entries shall be counted when entering for any class i.e. **15<sup>th</sup> May 2022**.
5. Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes but when entering for Variety classes, wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. A First prize does not include a Special prize of whatever value.
6. If an exhibitor reports before judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:-
  - 1) **Withdrawal** – the dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulations 9(j) & 20.
  - 2) **Transfer** – If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its breed, colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height and, in the event of there being no equivalent class. Minor Puppy & Puppy excepted to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.
  - 3) If an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy class, Puppy class or Junior class, which is over age but under 12 calendar months, 18 calendar months of age or 24 calendar months respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy class, Junior class or Yearling class respectively for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.
  - 4) For any reason other than above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.
7. If an exhibitor arrives late & misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may **NOT** be transferred to any other class.

**MINOR PUPPY:** For dogs of six and not exceeding nine calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

**PUPPY:** For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

**JUNIOR:** For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

**NOVICE:** For Dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or three or more First prizes at Open & Championship Shows (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy & Special Puppy classes excepted, whether restricted or not).

**POST GRADUATE:** For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or five or more First prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit or Open Classes, whether restricted or not, at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

**LIMIT:** For dogs which have not become Champions under Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club or won seven or more First prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit or Open Classes, confined to the breed, whether restricted or not, at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

**OPEN:** For all dogs of the Breed for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at this Show.

**VETERAN:** For dogs of not less than seven years of age and over on the 1<sup>st</sup> day of the Show.

**NOT FOR COMPETITION:** Societies may at their discretion, accept Not For Competition entries. Societies may accept such entries from breeds of dog not included within the title of the Society. Fully vaccinated puppies of 4 calendar months or more may be entered NFC.

# REGULATIONS FOR THE PREPARATION OF DOGS FOR EXHIBITION F(B)

1. These regulations must be observed when a dog is prepared for exhibition and/or exhibited at any Kennel Club Licensed event. Objections may be referred to the General committee for disciplinary action under these show regulations and/or for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rule A42.
  - a. A dog found to have been exhibited in breach of these regulations will automatically be disqualified from exhibition at the show and from any award gained there.
  - b. Unless the exhibitor provides a satisfactory explanation for the dog being exhibited in breach of these regulations he/she may be subject to further penalties of either a fine or as listed under rule A42.2.
2.
  - a. No substance which alters the natural colour, texture or body of the coat may be present in the dog's coat for any purpose at any time during the show. No substance which alters the natural colour of any external parts of the dog may be present on the dog for any purpose at any time during the show.
  - b. Any other substance (other than water) which may be used in the preparation of a dog for exhibition must not be allowed to remain in the coat or on any other part of the dog at the time of exhibition.
3. No act or operation which alters the natural conformation of a dog or any part thereof may be performed except:-
  - a. Operations certified to the satisfaction of the General Committee.
  - b. The removal of dew claws of any breed.
  - c. Operations to prevent breeding provided that such operations are notified to The Kennel Club before neutered dogs are shown.

Nor must anything be done calculated to in the opinion of the General Committee to deceive.
4. The General committee without previous notice may order an examination of any dog or dogs at any Show. Any examination thus ordered will be made by a person having executive authority who shall have a written directive from The Kennel club in their possession. Samples may be taken for further examination and analysis.
5. An individual has the right to lodge an objection to a dog only if he/she is the owner or handler of a dog competing in the same breed or class. An objection may however, be lodged by an official of the Show or by anyone so deputed by The Kennel Club. It will be the responsibility of the individual who lodges the objection of the official (as appropriate) to substantiate the grounds for the objection. The Kennel Club will substantiate the grounds for an objection made on its behalf.

6. Any objection by an individual related to an infringement of these Regulations must be made in writing to the Show Secretary at his/her office before the close of the Show and the individual must produce evidence of identity at the time of lodging the complaint.

## ROUTES TO THE SHOW

- 1 FROM NORTH WEST, GLASGOW: M74 – A74 – M6 to Birmingham – M5 to Almondsbury interchange (near Bristol) – M4 East towards London. Leave M4 at Junction 18 (see 5).
- 2 FROM NORTHEAST, EDINBURGH: A1 – A1(M) – Into M1 South, off at Junction 23A for M42 for 56 miles, into M5 to junction with M4 (Junction 15), east to Junction 18 (see 5).
- 3 FROM THE EAST, NORFOLK, LONDON, KENT: A1 – North; A12 – Norfolk; A2 – Kent; A20 – Kent; M3 – Sussex. Join M4 westbound, leave M4 at Junction 18 (see 5).
- 4 FROM THE SOUTH & SOUTH WEST, CORNWALL: A30 to Exeter – Honiton by-pass – A303 – Ilminster – Ilchester – A37 Shepton Mallet – A367 Bath – A4 Chippenham. Turn left at Batheaston Fiveways Garage to RAF Colerne/Bannerdown.

ALTERNATIVE SOUTH COAST: A38 Plymouth – Exeter by-pass – Taunton – A361 to Glastonbury – A39 Wells – Midsomer Norton – Bath – A4 to Chippenham. Turn left at Batheaston Fiveways Garage to RAF Colerne/Bannerdown.

ALTERNATIVE FROM EXETER: M5 to Almondsbury Interchange – M4 eastbound to London, leave M4 at Junction 18 (see 5).

- 5 FROM M4 MOTORWAY, JUNCTION 18: Take A46 South for approx. 8 miles. Just before dual carriageway take slip road onto A4 (signposted Bath A4, Chippenham A4). Turn left at roundabout signposted Batheaston local. After 1 mile turn left onto Bannerdown Road - signposted to Show. ALTERNATIVELY, from A46 turn left onto A420 and turn right at Marshfield following signs to Colerne. (Unsuitable for caravans)
